# January - March 2022 Statistics

During January – March of 2022, Fort Myers – Islands, Beaches and Neighborhoods hosted more than 1.1 million visitors who spent an estimated \$1.4 billion while visiting – a 40.1% increase in spending year-over-year. Visitors staying in paid accommodations spent an estimated \$1.1 billion (80 percent of the total). Lee County's lodging industry experienced a year-over-year increases in average occupancy and average daily rate, resulting in a significant increase in revenue per available room (RevPAR).

# **Bed tax collection**

The preliminary resort tax collected for March 2022 was \$10,974,040, a 28.8% increase over March 2021 preliminary collections of \$8,522,826. Fiscal year-to-date preliminary tourist tax collections are \$39,814,433 an increase of 43.9% year-over-year.

# Airport news

During March 2022, 1,514,046 passengers traveled through Southwest Florida International Airport, an increase of 30.3% compared to March 2021. Year-to-date, passenger traffic is up 44.0% from the same period last year.

# <u>January – March res</u>earch report

Joseph St. Germain, with Downs & St. Germain Research, offered a tourism snapshot of January through March 2022. When compared to the same period in 2021, visitation increased by 23.3%, room nights increased by 27.8% and direct visitor expenditures increased 40.1% to more than \$1.4 billion. He reported that 92% of visitors came from the U.S. while 4% came from Canada. Visitors spent an average of 8.8 nights while visiting, and 35% reported being first-time visitors. # **Sports Development report**

Jeff Mielke, Sports Development director, reported that 31,424 room nights sold in the months of January through March 2022 with direct visitor spending of more than \$13.1 million.

#### **New business**

The Tourist Development Council (TDC) unanimously approved the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter budget reports.

#### TDC approves funding for Beach & Shoreline projects

The TDC unanimously approved funding recommendations for FY2022-23, allocating \$15,769,488 for 22 Beach & Shoreline projects throughout Lee County. These projects will be considered for final approval by the Board of County Commissioners as part of the FY2022-23 budget.

<u>TDC Attractions & Events Marketing subcommittee composition</u>
The TDC unanimously approved appointing council member Jay Johnson to the Events and Attractions Marketing subcommittee due to the vacancy created by former council member, Colleen DePasquale.
