

Report to the Industry May 8, 2025

January-March 2025 Statistics

From January through March of 2025, the Fort Myers area welcomed 782,000 visitors who spent an estimated \$1.1 billion– a 7.1% increase in year-over-year spending. Visitors staying in paid accommodations spent an estimated \$818 million, accounting for 73% of total visitor spending. Lee County's lodging industry saw a slight year-over-year decrease in average occupancy (-1.0%), while the average daily rate (ADR) increased by 5.0%, resulting in a 3.9% increase in revenue per available room (RevPAR).

Bed tax collection

The preliminary resort tax collected for March 2025 was \$8,042,582, a 4.42% increase over March 2024 preliminary collections of \$7,702,318. Fiscal year-to-date preliminary tourist tax collections are \$28,365,860 an increase of 3.64% year-over-year.

Airport news

During March 2025, 1,463,628 passengers traveled through Southwest Florida International Airport (RSW), a decrease of 3.1% compared to March 2024. Year-to-date, passenger traffic is down 3.6% from the same period last year.

<u>January – March research report</u>

Joseph St. Germain, Downs & St. Germain Research, offered a tourism snapshot of calendar year 2024 as well as January through March 2025. In calendar year 2024, Lee County attracted nearly 3.2 million visitors, resulting in direct visitor spending of \$3.1 billion. From January to March 2025, Lee County welcomed 782,000 visitors, a decrease of 5.6% compared to 2024, resulting in direct visitor spending over \$1.1 billion. The international market accounted for 8.3% of visitors during the January through March timeframe, with Canada representing the largest share at 5.0%. See the full report here.

Sports development report

Jeff Mielke, Sports Development director, reported that 34,827 room nights were sold from January through March 2025, generating \$16.3 million in visitor spending. He also noted that January 2025 recorded 21 events - the most in Lee County Sports Development (LCSD) history for that month. Additionally, February 2025 recorded the highest number of room nights for any February on record for LCSD.

New Business

The Tourist Development Council (TDC) unanimously approved the FY25 2nd quarter budget reports.

TDC approves FY2025-26 funding for Beach & Shoreline projects

After making legislative findings for 19 projects, the TDC unanimously approved funding recommendations totaling \$12,424,185 for 17 beach and shoreline projects.

They also recommended the Board of County Commissioners consider funding from tourist development tax reserves:

- 4 beach and shoreline projects totaling \$16,638,356
- 7 nature park projects totaling \$1,356,263

These projects will be considered for final approval by the Board of County Commissioners as part of the FY2025-26 budget.
