## Executive Summary: October 2006

- Lee's Fall 2006 tourism business has been relatively strong. Although weather turbulence impacted visitation in July and August, the industry's growth resumed in September. This October, the number of visitors to the Beaches of Fort Myers Sanibel rose by 2.7% (2005: 75,670; 2006: 77,710) and ADR grew by 8.9% (2005: \$96.25; 2006: \$104.84). While occupancy increased by 1.6 points over last October, Lee's tourism industry generated an additional \$8.1 million to the destination's level of activity (2006: \$87,587,957).
- **2.** Florida markets contributed most strongly to the expansion of visitation this October. In terms of market segments, this month's geographic visitor origins are as follows:

**3.** Lee's tourism industry has for many years successfully served its visitor base. This month, the Beaches of Fort Myers - Sanibel again capitalized on the good will of satisfied repeat customers, with some 68.3% reporting having previously stayed at the destination *(2005: 63.9%)*. Most importantly, fully 51.0% of this month's visitors say they will be back next year *(2005: 48.0%)*.

- **4.** Successfully attracting diverse market segments and developing new visitor niches is critical to the growth of a destination. Note this October, the business and meetings market segment grew strongly (+6.0%), as did the traffic from Europe (+6.6%).
- 5. While some 28.6% of Lee's October visitors drove to the destination, air travel remains the primary mode of transportation for the majority (2005: 72.3%; 2006: 69.8%).
- **6.** Importantly, Tampa/St. Petersburg and Miami/Fort Lauderdale are two of the top four origin DMA's this October. Lee's visitors came from the following top DMA's (in rank order):

- **7.** This month, reservation levels were less "predictable" than in previous years. October's *MANAGEMENT BAROMETER* reveals that better than two of every five visitors (41.4%) had no reservations or made them within seven (7) days of arriving in Lee (2005: 21.5%).
- **8.** This October, nearly nine of every ten visitors (88.1%) report Internet access. A majority of these (84.2%) retrieve travel information and 76.1% buy travel services via the Web. Additionally, of those who buy travel services on-line, 52.1% have booked lodging.
- **9.** In spite of some negative national economic indicators, Lee's *MANAGEMENT BAROMETER* foresees notable improvements in three-month forward activity and reservation levels:

#### Type of Message Seen




