Report to the Industry *May 11, 2017*

Winter 2017 Statistics

During the winter of 2017, The Beaches of Fort Myers & Sanibel hosted more than 1.3 million visitors who spent an estimated \$1.15 million while visiting – a one percent drop in spending year-over-year. Visitors staying in paid accommodations spent an estimated \$852 million (74 percent of the total). Lee County's lodging industry experienced a year-over-year decrease in average daily rate, along with a slight drop in average occupancy rates for the season, leading to a decrease in revenue per available room (RevPAR).

Bed Tax Collection

The preliminary resort tax collected for March 2017 was \$7,924,789, a 1.6 percent decrease over March 2016 preliminary collections of \$8,052,654. Fiscal year-to-date preliminary tourist tax collections are \$24,306,247, a decrease of 2.8 percent year-over-year.

Airport News

During March 2017, 1,252,124 passengers traveled through Southwest Florida International Airport (RSW). Figures represent a decrease of 1.4 percent compared to March 2016. Year-to-date, passenger traffic is down 2.8 percent from the same period last year. Carol Obermeier, Lee County Port Authority's director of air service development, noted that March 2017 was its second-best March on record.

Water Quality Update

Roland Ottolini, Lee County Natural Resources director, updated the TDC on the county's measures including capital improvement, source control and conservation land to improve its waterways and preserve its natural systems. He outlined the county's action plan at the federal, state, and local levels.

Date of November TDC Meeting Moved

The council voted to move the date of the November TDC meeting to Monday, Nov. 13, 2017.

First Quarter Research Report

Bob Domine, Digital Research Group president, reported on the winter 2017 season. Between January and March, visitation in paid accommodations remained steady while expenditures dipped slightly. Canada continued to deliver the largest share of international visitors for the winter season.

Sports Development Update

Jeff Mielke, Sports Development director, reported that 22,770 room nights sold in the first quarter of 2017 with direct visitor spending of more than \$9.5 million.

TDC Approves Funding for Beach & Shoreline Projects

The TDC formalized funding recommendations for fiscal year 2017-18 and allocated \$8,398,745 for 19 projects.
