

January – March 2020 Statistics

During January – March of 2020, The Beaches of Fort Myers & Sanibel hosted more than 1 million visitors who spent an estimated \$1.08 billion while visiting – a thirteen and a half percent decrease in spending year-over-year. Visitors staying in paid accommodations spent an estimated \$820 million (76 percent of the total). Lee County's lodging industry experienced a year-over-year decrease in average occupancy and average daily rate, resulting in a decrease in revenue per available room (RevPAR).

Bed Tax Collection

The preliminary resort tax collected for March 2020 was \$5,846,844, a 33.5% decrease over March 2019 preliminary collections of \$8,766,349. Fiscal year-to-date preliminary tourist tax collections are \$27,473,333, an increase of 3.3% year-over-year.

Airport News

During March 2020, 861,221 passengers traveled through Southwest Florida International Airport, a decrease of 41.9% compared to March 2019. Year-to-date, passenger traffic is down 11.4% from the same period last year.
