

# **Report to the Industry**

February 8, 2018

#### Fall 2017 Statistics

During the fall of 2017, The Beaches of Fort Myers & Sanibel hosted more than 1.1 million visitors who spent an estimated \$707 million while visiting – an eight percent increase in spending year-over-year. Visitors staying in paid accommodations spent an estimated \$526 million (74 percent of the total). Lee County's lodging industry experienced a year-over-year increase in average occupancy rate and average daily rate for the season, translating to an increase in revenue per available room (RevPAR).

#### **Bed tax collection**

The preliminary resort tax collected for December 2017 was \$3,518,946, a 12.3 percent increase over December 2016 preliminary collections of \$3,134,913. Fiscal year-to-date preliminary tourist tax collections are \$8,529,091, an increase of 15.5 percent year-over-year.

#### **Airport News**

During December 2017, 873,494 passengers traveled through Southwest Florida International Airport (RSW). Figures represent an increase of 3.9 percent compared to December 2016. Yearend passenger traffic was up 2.8 percent compared to last year.

## **Sports Development Update**

Jeff Mielke, Sports Development director, reported 2017 year-end highlights including an increased number of annual events to 144 that resulted in more than 150,000 room nights sold, and direct visitor spending of \$65,891,470.

### **Lee County Visitation Update**

Nicole Devine, DPA, reported on the fall season 2017 highlights. Visitation among visitors staying in paid accommodations increased by more than 5 percent, while total expenditures increased 7.9 percent, exceeding \$700 million. About one-quarter of fall season guests were from international markets with Canada representing the largest share at 9 percent.

#### A 2017 review of the Hotel Industry

Jennifer Foster, STR, presented an overview of the hotel industry. In 2017, Florida saw record-setting highs for occupancy, ADR, and RevPar. For 2018, STR projects Lee County's average occupancy will decrease 2.5% to 69.9%, ADR will increase 2.6% to \$155 and RevPar will be flat at \$108.

# **New Business**

The Tourist Development Council (TDC) unanimously approved the VCB fourth-quarter budget report.
